



## **2014/15 Pupil Premium**

Funding for the year was £253,657

The number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium was 191.5. (48% of children on role reception-year 6)

The school will receive the following funding for each child that has been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the last 6 years.

- £1,300 for each pupil in reception to year 6
- £1,900 for any child who has been in local authority care

## **Key objectives for 2014/15**

KS1 & Y6 use additional teacher to split classes into sets. Teaching in smaller groups of similar level pupils is shown to accelerate progress.  
To provide effective regular interventions to improve skills in line with the new national curriculum.
3. Wellbeing  
To address the personal, social and emotional needs of pupils through interventions to allow learning to take place.  
To build relationships with parents and to provide tools to assist them support their children's learning and emotional development.
4. ICT  
To further invest in ICT to enable the accelerated reading project to develop.  
To invest in ICT to support specific children and their needs.
5. Specialist support  
To engage with specialist who can provide advice and support concerning specific children and their requirements.  
To provide training for teachers and support staff.

## Attainment and Progress

Funding for Pupil Premium during 2014 -15 enabled a range of interventions to be delivered successfully to children throughout the school.

The impact of spending on these overall was to close completely the gap in progress between children who were on Pupil Premium and others in the school. (Average progress for all children across the school was good.)

Children made on average the following progress:

(3.5 points = good progress)
