



Forest School

We are very excited to be running a Forest School for all of the children in Reception this academic year. It will be held in the nature reserve area of Southwark Park on Mondays by Miss Rutherford. Each child in Reception will have the opportunity to attend a two hour session for an eight week period.

Forest School is an outdoor educational learning experience that encourages children to connect with nature through a range of activities taking place in a natural environment. The experience of outdoor learning combined with the practical, hands on aspects of forest school has shown to be a successful way to motivate children and deepen their learning.

Year 3 & Year 4 trips

Last week the Year 3 classes went on a trip to Wrotham in Kent. The children built shelters in the woods using natural materials. They also cooked their own bread over an open fire. After that the children used hacksaws and glue guns to make miniature models of our shelters to bring back to school.

The Year 4 classes visited London Canal Museum. The children took part in an interactive workshop where we assumed the role of canal engineers. The children worked in groups to dig a tunnel through a sand castle in order to discover the importance of strength in a structure and look at beams and arches. To complete the workshop the children worked in pairs to build their own mini arches using a range of materials. The second activity was a local walk to explore the geography of the local area with reference to how the growth of the canals. The final activity was based in the museum and called the canal detectives. The children investigated arrange of topics including, the internal structure of a canal boat, clothing worn by 19th Century canal people and how horses were used to pull canal boats. It was a very informative day and year 4 are now ready to apply their knowledge to some simple bridge building !



Bilingual Reading Scheme

At Southwark Park we now have a subscription to Kitaboo!, an online reading scheme with bilingual books in more than 20 different languages as well as English. These are ideal for parents' who are keen to read at home with their children in English and keep up their home language at the same time.
